

Meeting Minutes - CDA
Court of the Immaculate Conception #322
Tuesday, April 2 - Cathedral of the Holy Spirit Parish Hall

Father John Paul Gardner led the rosary. Regent Marella Krein opened the meeting. Regent Krein asked if there were any changes to the March Minutes and Treasurer's Report available for review on the tables.

Regent Krein reported a change to the March Minutes that will be corrected **to show that the Treasurers report is for February 2024 and not March 2024**. The Treasurer's Report for March 2024 was approved, and details are listed below:

- Beginning balance \$4,421.03, total income - \$710.03 (includes bingo, dues, bake sale, card party and cash change for card party and bingo), expenses - \$1,205 (includes badges, down payment of \$500 to Cathedral of the Holy Spirit Church capital campaign pledge, with an additional \$1,000 balance to be paid for a total pledge of \$1,500, cash prizes for education awards), total savings - \$715.13, total assets - \$4,641.19.
- Virginia Dolajak asked about the highlighted amount of \$1,545.25 reported on the Treasurer's Report. Mary Ann Morford reported it is money that came from families of members who have passed away and give a memorial amount of money to the Court. The Court is able to use that money toward special things that the Court may need. In the past, some of the money has been used for card tables, the Blessed Mother statue, the table for the Blessed Mother, the laminated cards used for the meetings and the plaque with the names of the past Regents.
- Karen Selensky asked if all members sold or bought their \$20 worth of tickets for the card/bingo party. Regent Krein reported that the goal was that everyone that received them would buy or sell them as we have so few fundraisers, but that does not happen very often. It is on the honor system, the Board does not keep track of who donated and who did not.

Regent Krein introduced Sharol Haugen, Court Education Coordinator to introduce the winners of the CDA 2023-2024 National Education Contest. Themes for the contest: **“God's Love and Kindness Will Shine Upon Us Like the Sun That Rises in the Sky” or “How Does My Love Shine For Others”**.
